In Fiscal Year 2011

- Over 250 adults received Public Guardian and Conservatorship protection
- An average of 200 families received information regarding Adult Guardianships
- The Bureau of Contract Management, Office of Fiscal Operations, processed 1,078 contracts
- The Office of Administrative Hearings received 539 requests for hearings and conducted 927 hearings related to those requests
- Licensing Specialists licensed all Human Services Programs in the State including: approximately 2,100 foster homes, 40 child adoption agencies, and 900 treatment programs.
- The Office of Licensing screened 40,000 applicants, including new initial and annual renewal screens

In Fiscal Year 2010

- Substance abuse and/or mental health services were accessed by 60,638 Utahns
- 85% of people who received mental health services either stabilized or improved
- Over 72.1% of clients achieved abstinence from alcohol and/or drugs at discharge from treatment
- More than 165,000 Utahns with serious mental illness or substance use disorders are not receiving treatment
- In addition to the funding shown above, the County local authorities will contribute \$18,351,180 in County funds
- The Local authorities will use State and County funds to draw down \$92,774,805 in Medicaid funds

- Child Protective Services investigated 19,838 cases. Of those, 8,320 (42 percent) were supported
- Domestic Violence Shelters received 29,529 calls
- Foster care services were received by 4,652 children
- 539 children were adopted from foster care services

- Congregate meals served: 844,635
- Home-delivered meals provided: 1,224,695

- The Senior Community Services Employment Program (SCSEP) had a job placement rate of 51.2%
- The Home and Community-based Alternatives Program assisted 1,085 individuals

In Fiscal Year 2010

- Work programs provided assistance to 254 youth. These work programs hold youth accountable for their delinquent behavior by providing opportunities for restitution.
- On average, 498 were served each day in residential and non-residential community programs. These treatment services are delivered by private providers.
- Locked detention facilities admitted 10,104 youth, which provide short-term confinement for youths.
- Secure Care facilities admitted 237 youth, which provide long-term confinement for the most serious youth offenders.
- Volunteers made 25,672 visits and provided 119,032 hours of service.
